IN MEMORY OF NATALIE ROSE PURYEAR 1949-2010

Natalie Rose Wilson Puryear was born on the West Side of Chicago, and soon became a very high-spirited, independent, and very outgoing youth who excelled academically, while participating in cheerleading, dance, music and other activities. After attending the University of Illinois at Chicago, Natalie began her career as a corporate buyer for a major multi-national corporation. Natalie excelled and moved up the ranks until she decided that she wanted to spend more quality time with her two sons. She then moved into the real estate industry working for Amico, Trico and others and also founded her own firm. Natalie discovered that she had a passion for home sales because she was able to increase pride in the community by personally increasing black home ownership.

Natalie Rose, cleverly named after her father Nathan Rosmond, shared many traits with him. Nathan and Natalie both had careers at Sears, both were passionate and hardworking individuals who always took care of their family and both gave back to their community. Natalie was a prominent figure who, in addition to her community-focused Real Estate initiatives, also became a vital member of many not-for-profit organizations in Chicago such as Africare, Jazz Unites, and Chicago Gospelfests. Natalie was a Charter Member of Lake Shore Chapter of The Links and contributed her financial and public relations expertise to support the Links' programs of service in the arts, youth, national and international communities. Natalie also showcased the art, architecture and music of South Shore by coordinating the annual "Celebrate South Shore" events.

For more than ten years, Natalie has been Vice President of Communications for the Black United Fund of Illinois (BUFI). One of Natalie's accomplishments at BUFI was her creation of the "Living Legends/Passing the Torch" Awards. This event annually honored Legendary African American men and women who not only had a major impact in the communities they served, but also cared enough to ensure they left a successor to keep their initiatives alive. Although Natalie awarded others, she actually was a real living legend to her two sons, her many nieces and nephews, and the South Side of Chicago.

2013-2014 NPCL Scholarship Program

The Natalie Puryear Community Leader (NPCL) scholarships are awarded to students in recognition of both academic excellence and community service. This memorial scholarship honors Chicago High School seniors who value public higher education and is offered through the generosity of Natalie Puryear and The Black United Fund of Illinois (BUFI). **This scholarship is nonrenewable.**

Award Amounts

Two (2) scholarships will be awarded for the Fall 2013-Spring 2014 school year. The sum of each award will equal Fifteen Hundred Dollars (\$1500) for the school year, to be distributed in two installments (\$750 per semester), directed towards textbook and material costs; however, the monies can be used by the recipient for whatever educational need that arises. The checks will be mailed to the recipients upon confirmation of Enrollment and Curriculum at the beginning of each semester. A form will be provided from BUFI for verification by the college or university of their enrollment each semester and should be mailed to the Black United Fund of Illinois (BUFI) at the address below.
